Following a short-lived stint of retirement, Gary and his wife Duffy, have opened the NT's first liquor superstore and largest drive-through, the Cellarbrations Superstore at Pinelands. 'It's been a 50-year family dream to open the very first liquor superstore and meet the growing demand in the Darwin and Palmerston communities,' said Gary. 'Territorians are crying out for a better range of alcohol, and we're excited about catering to this void in the market and meeting the needs of the discerning drinker in a responsibleway.'Cellarbrations Superstore at Pinelands is outbound on the Stuart Highway between Berrimah and Palmerston. Their state-of-theart retail store features an impressive specialty section, featuring a unique



range of international and Australian wines and French champagne. 'Our wines reflect a diverse range of regions, blends and vineyards,' said Gary. 'Red wine connoisseurs in particular will be delighted with the selection of products in our ambient temperature refrigeration system.' Whisky (and whiskey) lovers will be in heaven, with the Superstore specialising in the spirit, as will boutique beer drinkers. 'As we're an independently-owned liquor store, we have the advantage of being able to bring in liquor that can be hard to get and that other major retailers don't have access to.' Cellarbrations Superstore at Pinelands may be a long way from the days of the first drive-through bottle shop, but the Colemans' philosophy remains the same: helping Territorians celebrate by offering variety and quality.
